# Important Information

## DMP & DMQ

MONDAY-THURSDAY: Students will complete 3-5 questions about topics previously or currently being covered. DMP will not be graded based on correct answers. However, I will be taking a grade on students getting started on time, attempting EVERY problem, and making corrections when I go over the answers.

Friday-students will take a 5 questions quiz every Friday over questions covered during the weeks DMP. The DMQ will be graded for correct answers and will be worth 10 points every Friday.

## Accelerated Math

Students will be assigned objectives that go along with current or past material. Students will have objectives due every 1-2 weeks. Each objective is worth 2 points. Example: If 5 objectives are due it will be worth 10 points.

## Study Island

Students will be assigned study island lessons as we cover the topics in class. Students will be given 1-2 weeks to complete the assignment and earn a blue ribbon.

## Problems of the Week

Six problems will be posted on the bulletin board in the back of the classroom each week. Students are required to answer two problems each week. Students have the opportunity to answer a third question to earn extra credit each week. This could be the only extra credit offered. Each question will be worth two points, one point for the correct answer and one point for a detailed explanation.

## Unit Tests/Quizzes

After a unit or several lessons students will be required to take a cumulative test over the material. Any notes, worksheets, or practice papers should be used as a study guide. Study guides will not be provided for every unit.

## Choice Board/Projects

Students will complete 2 projects per nine weeks. Dates for these projects will be given in advance. Students may choose the type of project and the content of the project. I will provide a list of requirements for each project. Students must complete the project over material that is taught during that nine weeks. Students will be given a rubric to help them complete the projects. Each project will be worth 20-30 points.

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## Late work

Assignments are expected on the due date. Points may be reduced if not completed on time. AM will be reset weekly and students will be unable to turn in AM objectives after the due date. Partial credit will be given to the objectives completed at the time of the due date.

## Absent Work

- ◆ Students are responsible for making up missed work.
- ◆ Students will be given the number of days absent completed missed work.
- ◆ If absent on test day, it is expected the test is made up on the day of return.

## RETEST OPTION

If a student wishes to improve his/her test grade they may request to retest on most tests. The highest score will go in the gradebook. If a student wishes to retest they must do 3 things.

- 1.) schedule a retest with the teacher during a student's free time. (Lunch, recess, before school)
- 2.) have a parent/guardian sign the original test.
- 3.) complete a remedial assignment approved by the teacher. (test corrections, alternate assignment, additional worksheet...)
